# Proceedings

#### 1. Admin/Financial

- The Council approved the minutes of the previous meeting (13<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> June 2018). Michael proposed and Sebastian seconded.
- The Council approved the minutes of their conference call on 29<sup>th</sup> March, in which they reviewed the effectiveness of the internal controls for 2017. Michael proposed and Sebastian seconded.
- Matters arising: none.
- The Council reviewed their Service Level Agreement with the ESRI. The ESRI have proposed a new cost basis for the agreement. The Council reviewed comparable costs for the necessary services (office space, accounting, HR advice, and IT support) and feel they have a strong case for procuring those services in one bundle, and consider the current arrangement sensible. asked the Secretariat to continue negotiating this agreement.

- The Council approved the draft Financial Statements for the year ended 31st December 2017 subject to no material changes. The Council asked the Secretariat to reword the text about the weakness in internal control to clarify that the weakness is the lack of documenting decisions (the Council regularly review the services and their associated costs), and not the procurement of those services. The Secretariat will email any further changes to the Council.
- The Council approved the draft Annual Report for 2017 subject to no material changes. The Secretariat will email any further changes to the Council.
- The Council considered the letter from the Department of the Taoiseach to all Secretaries General in February 2018 regarding the Reform of Government Strategic Communications. The Council are happy for the **Gov.ie** website to continue linking to the Council's website. The Council feel that their work falls outside the scope of the Reform of Government Strategic Communications, and so wish to keep their website separate from the Gov.ie website, and keep their identity distinct from the proposed single unified identity. The Council should write to the Department of the Taoiseach to explain this decision.
- Standing items:
  - The Council reviewed the Purchases and Receipts Book (June 2018).
  - The Council reviewed the Management Accounts (Q2 2018).
  - Recruitment: The Council will need to recruit a new Research Assistant to fill a soon-to-be vacated existing Research Assistant position. The two summer internships have begun.

- The Council received three Parliamentary Questions since the last meeting.
- The Council received no Freedom of Information requests since the last meeting.
- The Council discussed item № 3 (Governance and Structure) from their **Risk Register**. The Secretariat will look into using the Office of Government Procurement's contract for Travel Management Services to free up admin resources. The Council also recommended selecting a single, reasonably-priced hotel for members to use, instead of using admin resources to regularly compare hotels for lower prices. (Only two members of the Council will need accommodation in Dublin for the remaining meetings in 2018.) The Secretariat will contact the Parliamentary Budget Office (PBO) about the development of their draft mandate.
- The Council discussed recent meetings:
  - Seamus presented at the ESRI's "Budget Perspectives 2018" conference on 9<sup>th</sup> June.
  - Seamus attended the third International Conference of Councils on Economic Policy on 22<sup>nd</sup> June in The Hague.
  - Seamus participated in the 2018 National Economic Dialogue on 27<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> June in Dublin Castle.
  - Seamus attended the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the OECD Network of Parliamentary Budget Officials and Independent Fiscal Institutions in Seoul on 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> July. Seamus also attended a meeting of the EU Network of Independent Fiscal Institutions (EUNIFI) while there.
