• Long-Term Fiscal Work: This project will see the intern contribute to the Council's ongoing research programme on long-run fiscal implications of demographic change. In addition to core requirements below, the ideal candidate will have excellent quantitative skills and proficiency in Microsoft Excel and a keen interest in data-driven research.

- organisational skills including a proven ability to work to deadlines; and
