Speakers

Svein Gjedrem is a Norwegian economist and former Governor of the Central Bank of Norway. He has played an influential role in the establishment and running of Norway's Sovereign Wealth Fund.





Kevin Page is a Canadian economist. As well as being the founding President and CEO of the Institute of Fiscal Studies and Democracy at the University of Ottawa, he was also the first Parliamentary Budget Officer for Canada.

Killian Carroll is an Economist at the Irish Fiscal Advisory Council. He is currently pursuing a PhD in University College Dublin, having previously completed an MSc. Quantitative Economics there and a BSc. Economics and Mathematical Sciences in University of Limerick.





Frances Ruane is the Chair of Ireland's National Competitiveness and Productivity Council. She was previously a member of the Commission for Ireland's National Pension Reserve Fund. She has held academic and senior administrative positions at Trinity College Dublin between 1977 and 2006 and was Director of the ESRI from 2006 to 2015.

Karina Doorley is the Research Area Coordinator for the Tax, Welfare and Pensions team at the Economic and Social Research Institute (ESRI). She received her PhD from UCD in 2012 having studied economics at Cambridge University and UCD. She previously worked at the Institute for the Study of Labor and at the Luxembourg Institute of Socio-Economic Research.





Nick Ashmore is the Director of the Ireland Strategic Investment Fund. From 2015 to 2021 he served as Chief Executive of the Strategic Banking Corporation of Ireland. He originally joined the National Treasury Management Agency as part of the team managing the National Pensions Reserve Fund in 2006.
