1. Closed Session

The Council met in closed session.

2. Admin/Financial

• Update on OECD recommendations

The Government Legislation Programme (Spring 2025) has listed the draft legislation regarding proposed amendments to the Fiscal Responsibility Act for 'Priority Drafting Spring Session 2025'.

Annual review of the effectiveness of internal controls

3. Research Strategy

The Council reviewed and agreed the draft checklist ensuring a consistent approach is applied, aligning with the Council's research priorities and strategy, when the Secretariat is considering undertaking new analysis, modelling or research ideas to include pitching potential work prior to commencement.

4. Department of Finance Presentation

The Council had a discussion ahead of Department of Finance Presentation.

John McCarthy, Chief Economist/Assistant Secretary General and colleague(s) from Department of Finance's Economic and Budget Division joined the meeting and presented forecast projections in respect of its Annual Progress Report 2025 covering the years 2025 to 2030 and responded to questions raised by the Council. The Council thanked the Department of Finance representatives who then left the meeting.

5. Endorsement Discussion

The Council held further discussions related to the Department of Finance's preliminary forecast projections in respect of its Annual Progress Report 2025 in the context of a decision regarding endorsement.

The Council was satisfied that the final forecasts are within an endorsable range, taking into account the methodologies used and the plausibility of the judgements made. The Council endorses as within the range of appropriate forecasts the set of macroeconomic projections prepared by the Department of Finance for its Annual Progress Report 2025 covering the years 2025 to 2030. A draft of the text of the endorsement letter will be circulated for review and final approval.

The Council will discuss the endorsement process and assess the macroeconomic projections in the forthcoming Fiscal Assessment Report (FAR).

6. Ongoing Work

An update was provided on current work plans to include:

The potential timelines for the endorsement note and the FAR will be determined by the Government's Annual Progress Report 2025 publication date.

The BEPS paper is currently being finalised for review with plans to publish on 8/9 April. A more comprehensive draft of the Revenue and expenditure comparisons paper should be available over the next few weeks. It is hoped to present on progress on the VAT pass-through paper at the next Council meeting. In addition, work is progressing on plans for an updated climate paper.

The Summer Internship project will help enhance the core component model, updating demographic and population projections, to contribute to part of the Council's next long-term sustainability report.
